of the Nebraska members on the board of lady. managers of the World's Columbian commission, has received the following suggestion from Bertha M. H. Palmer of Chicago, president of the board. It speaks of the necessity of the members emisting in the cause of an appropriation for women's work at the fair: "The legislatures of the different states will shortly be in session, and the question of appropriations for the expenses of state exhibits, organization, etc., is an important matter which will be brought before them.

Mrs.John S. Briggs of this city, who is one

the commissioners of the several states,
"The lady managers are urgently requested
at the same time to—use—their best endeavors toward having a sum, as large as possible, specifically named and set aside for the state work of women, and the expenses incident

"This is a most important consideration, since a congressional appropriation, should one be voted, would undoubtedly be available for state use." In view of the near approach of the conven-ing session of congress, and the possible modification of portions of the bill which in-corporated the World's Columbian commission, it beneaves each and every member of our board to be especially vigilant concern-ing that section 6 which relates to the duties of the board of lady managers. And to that end you are carnestly directed to communicate with the senators and representatives of

your state immediately, with instructions to carefully guard this section at every point and prevent any change in the status of the and prevent any change in the status of the law.

The first session of the lady managers has fully justified the World's Columbian commission, which authorized the convening of this board and prescribed its duties in accordance with the spirit of the act of congress, and has indicated to the world that the commission made to the world that the commission made no mistake in its numerical ensemble of the board, while the calm dignity and wise deliberations which have characterized its meetings has compelled the enthusiastic endorsement of a nitherto skeptical public.

It becomes therefore our most serious and imperative duty to see to it that no carping spirit shall overthrow the will of the people in this initial success, and with the eternal vigilance which is ever the price of all good, iet us indicate to the World's Columbian commission our appreciation of its wise comprehension of this act by directing our legislators to carefully watch, protect and uphold the law as indicated in the act of congress.
