The party consists of H. F. Nelson, president of the Minneapolis board of trade, a dealer in lumber and the owner of a paper mill; J. M. Bartlett, a dealer in real estate; George H. Warren, a member of the city council and interested in mining lands; George H. Partridge, a wholesale dry goods dealer; and a member of a loan and trust company.

These gentlemen from a committee from the business men of Minneapolis, which left for the city yesterday morning and will remain here until tomorrow morning and will go to St. Paul, returning home Sunday.

Each member of the committee investigates the business of the cities visited in his particular line, but the main object of the trip is to examine into the operations of the boards of public works.

Mr. Bartlett acted as spokesman of the party and stated to a Bee representative that legislation was pending in the Minnesota legislature to provide Minneapolis with a board of public works and the committee has been sent to cities provided with such boards to investigate the workings and report to the city council. "We are preparing to make comparisons between the manufacturing industries of the various cities, and with that in view each member of the committee investigates in his particular line of business."

"You have a fine city here," he continued, "but you should improve the affairs of the city and the county and get rid of this continual friction in affairs. Another thing which is radically wrong in Omaha is your assessment. It looks bad to say your valuation is \$20,000,000. Our valuation at home is \$18,000,000 and it looks peculiar to an eastern man. It is something which needs explaining and should be changed. Our assessment is as near a third of the actual value of the property as an assessor can fix it. When we return," said Mr. Bartlett in conclusion, "we will make our report to the exchange and you can see our opinion of Omaha, but I can say that it will be favorable."

The committee called on Secretary Nason of the board of trade and on several city and county officials in their search for information.

Yesterday afternoon the committee visited the city building and were shown through the various departments. They were very favorably impressed by what they saw and were not backward in expressing their approval.
