

THE SPECULATIVE MARKETS.

Wheat Opened Stronger, But Soon Became Very Nervous.

TRADERS ATTEMPTED TO UNLOAD, BUT THE SLIGHT ADVANCE WAS IMMEDIATELY OVERCOME AND THE BREAK SWEEP EVERYTHING AWAY AT ONCE.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 12.—The wheat market opened stronger today but soon became quiet, unsettled and nervous.

The export clearances from four ports aggregated 325,000 bu of wheat and flour in addition New Orleans shipped 25,000 bu.

The Michigan crop report notes an increased acreage of wheat and reports the condition at 81 per cent advanced for the year.

The wheat market opened at 10c for No. 2 hard winter wheat, 9c for No. 2 soft winter wheat and 8c for No. 2 white winter wheat.

Receipts at the port of New York were 20,000 bu of No. 2 hard winter wheat, 15,000 bu of No. 2 soft winter wheat and 10,000 bu of No. 2 white winter wheat.

At the close of the day the market was 10c for No. 2 hard winter wheat, 9c for No. 2 soft winter wheat and 8c for No. 2 white winter wheat.
