

THE SPECULATIVE MARKETS.

Wheat Was Dull and Weak Most of the Session.

SOMETHING OF A SURPRISE IN CORN.

Prominent Features of Saturday's Operations Had Entirely Disappeared, but Transactions Were Limited—Stocks and Bonds.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 30.—Wheat was dull and weak during most of the session. The bulls were timid while the bears, having the best of the market, were more aggressive. Cables were weak and lower with domestic markets also tending downward. Indications pointed to a large increase in the visible supply while the local receipts were largely in excess of the estimate and the northwestern deliveries also liberal. Considerable long wheat came on the market and bids with the exception of the forward market were steady or higher.
