



THREATENED MURDER IF NOT PAID

The Father Starts Out with Six Thousand Dollars, but the Villains Become Frightened Before His Arrivat and Surrender the Wad.

New York, Feb. 3.-A band of daring kidnapers stole Ward Ferris Waterbury, the S-year-old son of Charles P. Waterbury, a well-to-do farmer of Long Ridge, Coun., which is near the New York line, and have been holding him for \$6,000 ransom. In many respects the case is similar to the famous abduction of Charley Ross near Philadelphia in 1874.

The child was stolen on Monday, within an eighth of a mile of his home, while on his way to school. So well planned was the outrage that practically no trace of the kidnapers was left behind after they had gone a mile and a naif. It all happened in a thickly settled and respectable community, and the father bad received a letter from the men who had his child threatening that if he did not promptly pay them they would kill the lad, and intimating that they would also

the lad, and intimating that they would also wreak vengeance on his head.

The demand of the child stealers, who signed themselves "River Boys," was that the money should be paid to them at midnight last night on a bridge near Bedford, which is on the dividing line between Connecticut and Westcuester county, New York. It is far from a railroad station and reach of the telegraph. The father of the boy started to keep the appointment with \$6,000 in his pocket, all he could raise in such a short time. Deputy Sheriffs Howard, Pugsley and Stephen Hart of White Plains started for the scene late last night, having received word from Mr. Waterbury. They received word from Mr. Waterbury. They will protect the father and if possible appre

will protect the father and if possible apprehendthe kidnapers.

This morning a dispatch was received from Long Ridge that the kidnapers had been brought home early this morning by John Close of Stanevich, Conn. The boy had been left at his home of by a strange man who then ran away.

The boy said he was carried off by two men who took him to a small house and

men who took him to a small house and kept him until night, when they left him at the loor of the Close cottage.

The whole countryside was up in arms. The plan was a most daring one, and the parents of the stolen had were frantic. There may yet be a lynching of the ciliary of the country of the ciliary of the cil the stolen had were frantic. There may yet be a lynching if the viliains are caught. About fifty armed men spent all Monday night in searching the country for the boy with lanterns. Suspicion exists that Charles E. Waterbury, who is a nephew of the boy's father, knows more about the plot than he will admit. It was he who bere the note to Charles P. Waterbury, in which the kidnapers made their demand for \$5,000. He claims to have done nothing, but saw men armed with shotguns standing by the side of a phaeton. He was directed to give the note to Waterbury. What may prove significant is that the father's relatives were not on good terms and claim that he took an advantage of them in dividing the estate.
