WATER WORKS RECEIVER.

Affairs of the Company to Be Wound Up

in New Jersey. Mr. Charles Offutt has received word from New York that the chancellor-atlaw for the state of New Jersey had decided the American water works case in favor of the Underwood faction and would appoint a

receiver for the corporation. This was an action brought by certain stockholders in the corporation asking for a settlement of the stock of the corporation and praying for a receiver for the corpora-

The case decided some months since in
the United States court here in Omaha by

The results in the New Jersey case will
bring the business of the corporation to a
close, as the receiver appointed there will
wind up the affairs of the corporation.
Speaking of the status of the American
water works case yesterday Mr. John La
Webster, attorney for the receiver of the

water works case yesterday Mr. John L. Webster, attorney for the receiver of the Omaha plant, said that the appointment of a receiver for the corporation in New Jersey would have no effect upon the plant in Omaha whatever. The business of the water works here in Omaha will go right on just the same. In case there is a sufficient just the same. In case there is a surplus of cash at any time to be turned over to any-body the receiver in Omaha will probably be called upon to make such return to the re-ceiver of the corporation in New Jersey. But at present there is not much prospect of there being any cash to turn over. The improve-ments now under contemplation will make it necessary to borrow money if the work is pushed forward as it should be. The ques-tion of allowing the receiver to borrow the necessary funds to push the work to com-pletion is now before Judge Dundy, and when that is decided the receiver will know whether or not he can proceed with the completion of work that the city council desires completed this summer

Referring to the matter Mr. Bierbower, the receiver, said: "The water works plant is all in good condition and the public will never realize that the plant is in the hands of a receiver. It would never do to let a great concern like this get out of repair for there are too many important enterprises depending on the water service. It would paralyze the city to allow anything to get wrong with the water works. wrong with the water works. We shall keep the plant in good repair and if we are permitted to borrow some money the work that is needed by way of extending and completing some of the lines will be pushed to completion."

ANOTHER VIADUCT.

Plans for the Sixteenth Street Structure Works and City Attorney Connell held a conference yesterday upon the subject of ordering the construction of a new viaduct along the line of South Sixteenth street.
