

MAY SECURE A JURY TODAY

Few Features of Interest in the Irvine Trial Yesterday.

SPECIAL PANEL OF JURYMEN EXHAUSTED

All But One of the State's Peremptory Challenges Used While the Defense Has But Three Remaining—Other Lincoln News.

Lincoln, Neb., Oct. 12.—Special to THE BEE.—There was not time in the Irvine trial to interest the spectator or the reader today. Contrary to the general expectation of all, a jury was not secured today. The examination of candidates for the panel was hurried as rapidly as possible today and forty men were examined as to their qualifications, but a large majority of them stood under oath that they had already formed and expressed opinions in regard to the guilt or innocence of the accused and that they could not enter the jury box in an unprejudiced frame of mind. The state has exhausted all but one of its peremptory challenges, while the defense has but three left. At 2:30 this afternoon the special panel of six jurors was exhausted and another panel of five names was ordered. An adjournment was then taken until 10:30 tomorrow morning.

Caught in the Act.

NEBRASKA KNIGHTS ALIVE.

Twenty-Fifth Annual Convention of the Order Held at Geneva.

GINNEA, Neb., Oct. 11.—Special Telegram to THE BEE.—The twenty-fifth annual session of the grand lodge meeting of Knights of Pythias of Nebraska, was called to order yesterday by E. M. Bellings. He introduced C. H. Sizer, who on behalf of the knights of Geneva extended a welcome to the visitors, after which J. D. Carson, the mayor of Geneva, extended the welcome of the city. Responses were made in behalf of the grand lodge by W. S. Hamilton, grand chancellor, and H. M. Bushnell, grand preside. The grand lodge was then formally opened and business promptly started. During the day the usual routine of business was gone over, but an unusual amount of work was done for the first day. The session was to be a sentinel to do business and not none.

The usual number of new laws were introduced, and were nearly all disposed of thanks to the efficiency of the committee on law and the active work of the grand chancellor. The session was very moving rapidly.

Saffer, Bellevue; Lincoln; grand master of exchequer, J. E. Wright; grand master-at-arms, D. C. Deneen, Omaha; grand master-of-arms, C. S. Madsen, Webster; grand out guard, J. W. Turner, Franklin. The grand keeper of records and seal and grand master-at-arms were elected unanimously.

On the previous Bryan, representation from Marshall No. 41 came in this afternoon and was enthusiastically greeted. The grand lodge appropriated \$200 to cause the apprehension of the murderers of Knight C. P. Moore. The attempt to make the session of the grand lodge inconclusive was defeated. The next session was adjourned.

State Presbyterian Spread.

BRISTOL, Neb., Oct. 12.—Special Telegram to THE BEE.—The Nebraska Presbyterians spread began its annual session in this city last evening at the First Presbyterian church. Following the address of Dr. Gorham of Omaha, the ordinance of the Lord's Supper was observed and the synod was regularly constituted. The synod was presided over by Dr. R. F. Ringland, president of Hastings College. Dr. John C. Irwin of North Platte was elected moderator for the year, and Rev. A. J. Montague of North Platte and L. S. Boyce of Fremont, vice moderators. There are about 100 ministers and 1000 communicants.

Today's session was devoted to the reading and approval of reports, all of which indicate the highest prosperity of the Presbyterian church in this state. This evening Rev. Michael of New York and Rev. Marion of Chicago addressed the session on the subject of home and foreign missions.
