

Behold the jocuud farmer enroute with his load of corn to town, and disposing of it with a good conscience! The Nebraska Distillery company buys it from him and The Nebraska

from his compeers. Getting at the Essence. The innocent corn being stripped from the cob is ground into small pieces and mixed with water after which it is put into immense iron things called cookers where it is subjected to the action of heat. Being bolied sufficiently it goes to a well. It is now called "the mash" and is pumped from the well to the fermenting tubs, huge wooden vats which will hold 24,000 gallons. This partially liquified mash runs through a large spout and is a dull, muddy looking mixture

which to the uninitiated eye gives no sign of its future powers as a creator of ficticious nappiness. There are nine of these tubs three of which are kept filled all the time, in rotation, Before this liquid is turned into the tubs

malt has been put in.

A Chapter on Malt. Malt, you know, is barley put through the following changes: First, it is soaked in water for four hours and then spread in a layer three or four inches thick on a cement

floor where it is allowed to sprout during three days. It is then dried in a kiln and is ready for use in thirty days. This malt or yeast soon affects the mash, which begins to ferment, and can be seen oubbling and boiling in a way very suggestive of its after effect. After remaining in the fermenting vats seventy-two hours, the beer (its new name) is run into what is called the sewer, a sort of reservoir, from whence it is carried through a pipe enclosed in another

pipe filled with water, to the still room. Where Still Drunks Originate. The still is composed of twenty-two chambers of perforated plate. The beer goes in at the top of the still and is carried from one chamber to another through six-inch drop pipes. Steam from the boilers enters the still from the bottom and changes the alcohol of the beer into a vapor which is carried to a large iron tub called the goose tub, where a copper worm condenses it into a colorless liquid. This is the atcohol of drug store memory. Now the alcohol is sent to the rectifier, where it is changed to spirits. The rectifiers, of which there are thirty, are large cylindrical objects filled with charcoal. From the rectifiers the liquid is drawn into a capacious cistern, from whence it is barreled and sent forth.

The alcohol and high wine or spirits, look

exactly alike as they run through the narrow glass tubes side by side. The Government Boys Stay by It. Before it can be sold a government stamp must be applied to every barrel of it, in fact Uncle Sam's minions stay with it in its various stages from corn to high wine which is the basis of all whiskys. The tax on this liquid is only 90 cents a gallon and one barrel

holds about forty-six gations, so you see Uncle Sam is just a little interested in the manufacture of high wine and spirits. The iquid at 120 proof is known as high wine, and bushel of corn makes five gallons of

spirits and the tax on this would be 90 cents a gallon of 100 proof or \$1.50 per gallon at 100 The manufacturers make about 20 cents a gallon profit, so it is easily seen how promnent a part the tipplers and wine biphers

take in keeping up the running expenses of the government.

What is left of the beer after the alcohol

is extracted is fed to cattle of which the company has 1,900 head. The Starch Factory. When my fine gentleman sits up in his stiffly starched shirt front, collars and cuffs and tosses off his favorite potation of whisky in any one of its different forms he never thinks that the same innocent grain goes to make a stiff collar and a stiff drink. Yet so it is, and Nebraska City has the good fortune to manufacture the raw article for both. The starch factory has now been in operation some seven or eight ments and employs about fifty men, women and girls. The corn is first souled for threadily. sonked for three days in the steeping tubs and is then carried by a spiral conveyor in a trough to the elevator, where it is ground up. It then collects in shells and goes out through a spout down an inclined metal plane into shakers through polting cloth and through another trough into some tubs, from whence it is forced up into runs, where it is

first with a temperature of 600, the second If the work of drying is not done quickly the process is injured, for the starch must come out solid. It comes out with a brown crust which is scraped off and the starch is now ready for use when broken up. It is sent to the warerooms, where girls and women box and laber it. The starch made in Nebraska City is called the Argo and is for laundry and table use, a different process being used in preparing the latter. About 700 bushels of corn are used in a day, which is equivalent to 20,000 pounds. is equivalent to 20,000 pounds.

The Swiss silk used for bolting cloth is very expensive and must be often renewed—

about once a month.

But it does not quite lose its identity at the Neuraska City Canning company's factory, and they put a dainty and lifelike representation of an entire ear on the outside of each cas. From the husking shed where it is stripped of its outer garments the corn is carried by a conveyor to the second story of the factory, where it is cut off the cob by machinery at the rate of 1,500 cans per nour. It is sent to the lower floor through a machinery at the rate of 1,500 caus per nour. It is sent to the lower floor through a shute or sliker, which removes all the slik. From this it is sent to the cooker along a spiral shaped screw. Here it is thoroughly heated, or, as it is termed at the factory, exhausted. It then goes to the wiping table where it is but in caus and made ready for the cappers on caus. The last stage is a final cooking in retorts, when it is ready for labeling and placing in boxes. The output of 1892 will be 240,000 caus of corn. The tomate pack, on account of bad The output of lows will be sequented and of bad weather, will be light this year. Berries and fruits are canned in their season, but corn and tomatoes are the staples. The tomatoes are scalded and peeled by hand, put in cans and then cooked.

and then cooked.

The cans are made at the factory and furnish work for the winter and spring, the work beginning in January. The canning of corn and tomatoes begins about the middle of July. The factory has been in operation for five years and employs about sixty people. Most of the sales are made in Omaha, Kansas Citty and St. Joseph.

Finally, the coreal mill consumes a large quantity of Nebraska's staple product.
