Ean Juan Wealth Proves to Be the Product of Some Unhung Hyams.

COLLAPSE OF A GIGANTIC HOAX

Moving of a Mountain Threatens to Block a Tunnel-Industrial and Mineral Developments in the West-Passing of the Wyoming Raiders.

The wealth of the San Juan region, so much vaunted lately, follows in the wake of Idaho diamonds as an "irridiscent dream." Thorough investigation proves the gold laden diggings to be a gigantic hoax, invented by some unhung wretch.

A correspondent of the Sait Lake Tribune who accompanied a party of prospectors from Zion, writes that the Arizona Gable company bad filed on the placers on the north side of the river and was doing assessment work with nine men, that being the _extent of work, except new comers washing a few pans of dirt to see the number of colors. People were leaving as fast as they could, many dropping their supplies by the roadside because there is no sale for them. Our party decided to return home. At Pleasant creek we met parties returning from Dandy crossing, where they met hosts of men leaving the country by that route. disgusted, and saw many more turn back for

Green river or the Henry mountains. On the return trip we counted eightyeight teams and 180 men going in there being 283 animals, the teams generally being loaded, many with goods for sale, including seven or eight saloon outfits.

"As far as San Juan is concerned, it is a repetition of the White canon and Colorado river stampedes of six and three years ago, but on a larger scale. That this fake should last so long is owing to the fact that all railroad and telegraph points are from six to ten days distant, none being less than 200 miles, over bad roads."

Moving a Mountain.

A weird scene can be witnessed in the picturesque Santa Cruz mountains in California. It is nothing less than a small army of men trying to prevent a huge mountain from sliding into the gutter and destroying a large railroad tunnel. The wooded hill at Wrights station, on the Santa Cruz division of the Southern Pacific company, is slowly settling as if trying to find a level, and the railroad people have been working day and night to remove enough of the mountain to save the tunnel. At present 250 men are tolling all day and about sixty more labor at night by the light of bonfires made of brush hat has been removed from the mountain

The whole mountain side looks as if there had been a tremendous upheaval. No parallel to this accident has ever been known before in the history of railroads. The mountain side, which is full of springs, became so saturated at the time of the great storms early this winter that it began to slide to the gulch below and thereby crushed in one end of the tunnel, which is one and five-eighths miles in length. But 120 feet of the tunnel is known to have been affected, however. Back 200 feet from the northern mouth of the tunnel, and about 150 feet above it, a portion of the mountain side seems to have broken abruptly from the rest and commenced to slowly settle. It has continued to settle until now at the place where the division of the hillside occurred there is an abrupt wall twenty feet high showing that the mountain toward Wrights station had settled that much. There has never been any danger of accident, however, as a settling mountain moves slowly.

again. The snow has been showed of the grade to the Red Elephant group, and ore shipments are now regularly made, and the mill is running full force. In another week the long runs from the 114-foot level to the main level will be completed. Then an im-

mense body of ore can be stoped. The Ketchum smelters, which have been idle for the past six years, were "blown in" a few days ago. They are reducing North Star ore, a large amount of which is now on hand and large quantities arriving daily. The starting up of these large works again means a good deal for the Wood river country. A bill is now pending in the Idaho legisla-

ture providing for the construction of a wagon road through the state. If con-structed, this road will open up thousands of miles of the richest mineral sections of the state. The rich minds of Deadwood, John son, Sheep mountain, Scafoam and the Mid-dle Salmon districts will come to the front in fine shape as soon as there is a road over which to take machinery. The ores of these districts are copper, lead, gold and silver. At present these mines ship their ores to Ketchum, on Wood river, and have them re-duced at an expense of \$100 per ton. With reduction works on the grounds more than half of this expense can be saved. Then there would be a great boom in the heart of the side Salmon drag mountains the rich Salmon river mountains.

Co-Operative Sugar Beet Culture

A company has been formed to build and operate a beet sugar factory in southern California on the co-operative plan. The incorporators are farmers. Each member is expected to deliver to the factory a stated quantity of beets per annum, and if he falls short in his contribution the manager has the power to cultivate a corresponding quantity, and charge loss, if any, to the account of the man who did not deliver. But each lot of beets delivered is paid for on its merits, just the same as if it were owned by a stranger. The corporation furnishes seed to stockholders at actual cost, and all tools and implements needed at wholesale price. The estimate is for the handling of 30,000 tons of beets in one season, 10 per cent of which will be white granulated sugar at 5 cents per pound. I per cent yellow sugar at 3 cents, and 50 per cent pulp at 50 cents per ton. This, with the government bounty of 2 cents on the white and 1% cents on the yellow, will give a total annual gross income of \$486,000. The expenses for the season are estimated at \$257,000, of which \$48,200 is for labor, \$127,500 for beets, \$30,000 for 15,000 barrels of oil, and \$24,000 for interest on bonds at 6 per cent.

Sinughter of Stock.

Large numbers of cattle and horses have been killed on the Great Northern in Montana this winter. The road penetrates extensive ranges in the northern part of the state, and being unfenced the animals crowd on the track, especially during storms. Al-most every day a big killing is reported, and the loss to the company and the cattlemen is great. One day last week a freight ran into a lot of cattle bunched on the track near Dry Fork, cast of the Marias, and killed nine outright, while five more were so mangled that they had to be killed by the crew who arrived a few hours later. Next day a num ber were killed at Sidney, west of Fort Ben num ton, among them a couple belonging to Rob-ert Ford. While all cattle killed by the cars are to be paid for by the railroad company, the owners sustain quite a loss by numbers of cattle being badly hurt, yet being able to get quite a distance from the railroad before death comes to their relief, and in most of such cases the loss is directly upon the owners.

Salmon Canneries Combine.

An attempt is being made, according to the Sau Francisco Chronicle, to form a stronger combination of the saimon canneries in Alaska, and the reason is that as the output has not been regulated among the scattered packing houses, fluctuations in price have made profits uncertain in the past. In 1891 there was an overproduction of 800,000 cases. Last year a combination was formed, but by agreement it was to last only one senson. The object of the new movement is to "syndicate" all the thirty-eight canneries on a capital of \$5,000.600. The idea of the promoters is that with a combination the ANNOUNCEMENTS.
