THE FASTEST AFLOAT.

Boat. An account of the official trial of the new British torpedo boat destroyer, Hornet, which recently took place in the estuary of the Thames, shows that that craft is the fastest vessel of her type affoat. During a three hours' trial the average speed per hour was found to be 27,628 knots. This considerably eclipses any previous performance of any vessel of the Hornet's class, The best record claimed by any other builder of boats of this type is 27.22 knots per hour, said to have been made by the Chevaller, which was constructed by M. Normand of

Havre. After the official speed trial, the Hornet had a series of turning trials. Handiness is one of the most important qualities of a one of the most important quantities of the torpedo boat, and in this the craft was not found wanting. The vessel was circled at full speed, first to starboard, then to port. The result of the trial was in all respects

The result of the trial was in all respects satisfactory. The vessel was found to be very obedient to her helm, and her tactical diameter, which is the diameter of a circle, in which she can turn, was smaller than some of the experts expected that it would be, considering the length of the boat.

Another noticeable feature was the absence of vibration. Barely any was felt when running at reduced speed, and there was practically none when the throttles were wide open. There was no heating of any parts of the engines, and the boilers generated ample steam, with a mean air pressure of fifteen inches.

generated ample steam, with a mean air pressure of fifteen inches.

The Hornet is one of the thirty vessels recently ordered by the British Admiralty to be constructed at a cost of from £33,500 to £33,000 each. Two of the boats were built by Yarrow & Co. They are the Havock and Hornet. With the exception of boilers, both were alike in every particular. The Havock, which was fitted with locomotive boilers, has not proved to be as fast as the Hornet, which was equipped with the Yarrow patent water tube boilers.

It was stipulated in the contract that the Hornet should make a speed of twenty-seven knots per hour, with a load of thirty-five tons on board.

The Hornet is a twin screw boat, measuring 180 feet in length, by a beam of six-

The Hornet is a twin screw boat, measuring 180 feet in length, by a beam of sixteen feet six inches. Her forward parts are protected by a turtle-back, which extends from the bow to the after part of the conning tower. The steel of the turtle-back is of sufficient thickness to deflect part of the smaller sort. Under the back is of sufficient thickness to denect projectiles of the smaller sort. Under the forward deck is situated the forecastle, where part of the crew are berthed. In the compartment adjoining the conning tower is placed the steering gear. This boiler space extends from the gallery aft to the engine room.

In the engine room are two sets of triple expansion engines capable of developing

In the engine room are two sets of triple expansion engines capable of developing collectively 3,600 horse power. Abaft the engine room are the two cabins for the men of the engine room force and the officera' mess room and pantry. The armament consists of three eightsen-

The armament consists of three eighteeninch torpedo tubes, one twelve-pounder and
three six-pounder rapid fire guns. The
magazines are situated under the cabin.
The coal carrying capacity of the vessel is
sixty tons. This supply is believed to be
sufficient for a run of 4,000 miles at a tenknot speed. The compliment of officers and
