Wheat Rashed Up at a Dizzy Gait Yesterday and Closed 3-8 Cents Higher.

KANSAS CROP REPORT THE DAY'S FEATURE

Reductions in that State Nearly Fifty Per Cent, Being the Greatest Drop for a Single Month Ever Reported.

CHICAGO, June 6.—Wheat rushed up at a dizzy gait yesterday, finishing with 3 1/2c gain.

Extremely bullish crop reports scared shorts, and their frantic endeavors to cover resulted in an unusually active trade.

Wheat was strong and excited almost from start to finish. Opening trades were at 1/2c to 1/4c in advance, and after selling up 1/2c declined 1/4c, rallied 3/8, reacted 1/2c, changed some and closed strong.

The sensational feature was the Kansas crop report, which showed reductions for the state of from 25 to 45 per cent, being the greatest drop for a single month ever reported.

The various weekly weather bulletins were, as a rule, unfavorable, reaching the past week the worst since the season opened. There was a general scramble by anxious 'shorts' and room traders at the start to purchase, and at the advance long wheat came out, but it was readily taken, and the market again showed an upward tendency.

The latter cables helped the advance. Toward the last hour of the session the market was very excited under an active demand and limited offerings.

Corn was firm on the cold, dry weather, and the light movement in the interior. The range for the day was 1/4c and the close near the top.

Oats were excited and strong, covering 2 1/2c range and closing at the top. The strength resulted from unfavorable crop reports and the advance in the grain.

Provisions were dull but steady, helped by the strength in wheat. The market was a narrow one. Compared with last night wheat was 1/4c higher, lard 2 1/2c higher and July ribs 2 1/2c higher.

Freight rates steady at 1 1/2c for corn to Buffalo.
