A dissolute character named Walface, ac-

companied by two women, came to Ardmore, and, after purchasing over \$200 worth of goods, the man went to the express office and called for a package which was given him. He was arrested on suspicion, the package broken into and found to contain several gallens of whisky. From these parties it was learned the whisky was for other people said to be living near Elk, and from incautious remarks by the two ment the officers concluded it belonged to the Daltons, the Longview bank robbers, who are known to be in the neighborhood of Elk, twenty-five miles northwest of here. The man was locked up and a posses of United States marshals consisting of D. E. Booker, S. T. Lindsay, S. Leatherman, E. Reberts, W. B. Freeman, M. Glover, and the hero of the hour, C. Loss Hart, started for the freebooters' rendezvous. The place where they had reason to believe their game was in hiding was surrounded by the posse. While the men were taking their positions Dalton was seen to come out, look around and immediately return. The officers on the east side were discovered by him through a window or by some one in the house, and, platel in hand, he jumped through the window on the north and started to run east. Loss Hart was thirty yards from the house and called on him to halt. For reply he half turned around, tried to take aim while running and just then the chester of the officer spoke. To into the air were the only motions made by the fleeing man. His pistol fell to the ground and he sank. He expired without a

The house was searched and over 150 The house was searched and over 150 letters, besides numerous rolls of crisp bank bills were found, the address proving him to be Bill Dalton and the money proving him to have been the leader of the Long-view bank robbers. The remains were brought to this city and when his wife was teld that Bill Dalton was dead she became hysterical and almost succumbed to the shock. These is a reward of several thousehold. shock. There is a reward of several thou-sand dollars on Dalton's head. The deputy who killed him has wired to Longview that he has positive proof that it is Bill Dalton and that he committed the robbery.
