When neighbors arrived the body was lying in a pool of blood, the revolver still clasped tightly in the right hand.

Acting Police Surgeon Dibborn, who lives near by, was called and bandaged the head in order to stop the flow of blocd. Dr. Towne arrived a few moments later, but nothing could be done to save the man's life and he died in about an hour.

The deceased was 65 years of age. He came to Omaha twenty-six years ago and had lived here ever since, working in the Union Pacific shops for a number of years. Fr all accounts Mr. Redington was a sober, From dustrious man and had worked hard all his life to accumulate a little property. The coroner took charge of the remains.
