A GREAT DITCH. The Pecos Irrigation Canal the Largest in

The magnitude of some of the irrigation

works in this country is hardly appreciated

and but few persons realize what great sums have been spent in reclaiming our arid

regions. It will probably be news to most people that the largest irrigation reservoir.

in this country, and one of the largest in the world, has lately been completed in New Mexico by the Pecos Irrigation and Improvement company; moreover, this reservoir is but one of three great artificial basins in which enough water is stored to irrigate 250,which enough water is stored to irrigate 200, 000 acres of land, and works now under construction and proposed will raise this area to 400,000 acres. The land extends along the Peoos river valley for 170 miles, and is watered by a network of canals having already an aggregate length of 1,200 miles, while to render its products accessible to the large markers the owners of the property have built a railway 170 miles long up the valley from Peeos City. The great reservoir, called Lake McMillan, has been formed by build-ing a dam 1,686 feet long across the Pecos river. This dam is 54 feet high, 20 feet wide on top and 290 feet wide at the base. Its upstream portion is a bank of earth having a slope of one feet vertical in three and a half feet horizontal, while the downand a hair fret horizontal, while the down-stream part is of rough rock dumped in place. The earth keeps out the water, while the rock gives stability to the structure. The waste weirs have a capacity of 220,000 cubic feet a second, and have been given this unusual size in order to prevent a repetition of the washout which occurred some months ago on another reservoir belonging to the company. Over 96,000 cubic yards of rock and 107,000 cubic yards of earth were used in making the dam, and its cost was \$175,000. The reservoir formed in this way is about nine miles long, and its great-est width is three miles. Eight thousand acres of land are submerged, in places to a depth of fifty feet, and 5,000,000,000 cubic feet of water can be stored, enough to irrigate 80,000 acres from one filling. The flood waters from the river are sufficient to fill the lake twice during the year, without counting the normal flow of the stream, which is about 250 cubic feet a second. The capacity of irrigating reservoirs is usually expressed in acre fest, one acre foot being equal to 43,560 cubic feet of water.
