than Fifty Years. The Parisian house painter and decorator, Leclaire, was born the son of a country shoemaker. After working in the fields and as a mason's boy, he arrived in Paris penni-less at the age of 17. He apprenticed himself to a house painter, and in ten years became a master. As soon as he had secured his own footing in the trade, says the Pittsburg Dispatch, he turned his mind to improving the condition of those who worked in it. His first step was to seek a substitute for white lead, which he found injurious to their health. This he succeeded in doing. Much impressed with the uncertainty of their posi-tion, he went on to find a system by which every man in his employment received as bonus a part of the regular profits of his

One Establishment Has Kept it Up for More

For the regular and permanent workmen he also established a mutual aid society, sup-ported at first by the voluntary contribu-tions of members, but subsequently by the receipt of another considerable portion of the profit. His workmen thus not only became overness in the business but also accurd profit. His workmen thus not only became partners in the business, but also accrued a large addition to their wages, as well as an ample provision for old age, sickness or accident. Between 1842 and 1872, when he died a rich man, leaving \$240,000, Leclaire had paid the sum of \$220,000 in bonuses to his workmen, and in contribution to their mutual aid or provident society. His busi-ness was then carried on by two managing ness was then carried on by two managing partners, chosen by the workmen cut of their own number. It had a capital of \$54,000, be-

longing half to the managing partners and half to the mutual aid society. The mutual aid society owned a capital of

The mutual ald society owned a capital of \$310,000, including its shares in the capital of the business. It had 105 members, be-sides fity-one who were living upon theig retired allowances. To the regular workman it secured large yearly bonuses upon his asgregate wages; all the advantages of an ordinary benefit club; a life pension of \$240 per annum, payable on his completing his 50th year of life and his twentleth year of work for the concern; one-half of his pen-sion continued to his widow for life; a sum of \$200 payable to his family at his death; and his family, if he were killed by an accl-dent occurring in the course of his employ-ment, would not be left without permanent means of support. means of support.
