

## COMMERCIAL AND FINANCIAL

Wheat Slid Down and Made a New Low Price Record.

MAY CORN CLOSED A FRACTION HIGHER

New Low Price for December Wheat Was Made As Soon as the Regular Trading Commenced — Oats Opened Weak in Sympathy.

CHICAGO, Oct. 16.—Wheat slid down today until it had made a new low price record for December, at \$35; then, aided by buying shorts and reports of cash business, the market reacted, December closing steady, at \$35 higher. May corn closed 10¢ higher and May oats unchanged, but provisions were weak, finishing as declines.

The new low price for December wheat was the result of the regular trading commenced. The open interest was principally at from \$35 to \$36, with a sale or two at from \$36 to \$35. Another shave was taken off the under side of these quotations before any improvement started. When it began to recover it was under the lead of the corn market, which was the first to give signs of reviving animation. The routine statistics of the day and reports from outside markets were confirming the general idea of demand for cash wheat as reported early in the day, but did not exercise any influence until it was aided by the recovery in corn. Receipts were 215 car. At Minneapolis 335 carloads were received and at Duluth 88, making 1,220, against 929 car a year ago. Primary market receipts were 860,000 bu. Export receipts were 1,000,000 bu. Domestic grain stocks were 30,000,000 bu. December improved to from \$35 to \$34, with several relapses of its falling sickness, which sent it to \$33. The market was then up again, but was in one of its first moods near the close. There was considerable buying by shorts at the close and the market finished steady, at \$35.

The corn market opened firm, but the shorts were inclined to take their profits and improve later in the session, but in improved fashion. Receipts were out as expected. The opening price for May was 23¢ and subsequently it sold at 23¢, 22¢ and 21¢, while the market was 20¢ higher. HAY—Upward buy, \$.8¢, millet, \$.75, lowland, 47; eye straw, 4¢. Color makes the price on when this is mixed with other hay. In sight the outlook is anything but encouraging.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Notwithstanding the exceedingly small stock of fruit in the market, the indications favoring the early closing of the market says the New York Bulletin, and the indications favoring an actual scarcity of the fruit dealers this season, the market is still in a position to offer the offerings of new crop to arrive, the indifference of the trade being attributed to the uncertainty of the market, and the fact that it is delivered to the market late, owing to the lateness of the first tide in September this year, the initial delivery of the fruit being delayed until October. At that time four caravans were started, three for England and one for this country, but in November the market was weak, and it is said, will remain until the first tide of the present month arrives, when there will be a demand for the offerings of the two caravans bound to England, one only is credited with possessing any number of boxes, and the other is said to have the attention of the trade as it is present, as a part of the fruit contained in the former is sold under a name as a competitor of the direct shipment.
