Mr. and Mrs. Harris of Keith County End Their Lives Under the Most Distressing of Circumstances—Last Letter to Their Parents.

PAXTON, Neb., Jan. 14.—(Special Telegram.)—It has developed that the death of J. H. Harris and wife, an account of which was telegraphed to The Bee last night, was a most distressing tragedy.

The coroner's jury held this morning at the home of the dead couple the jury found that they came to their death by their own hands, a razor being used to commit the deed.

The couple had only moved to their present home a month ago. The house in which they lived was situated about seven miles southwest of here.
