HOME INDUSTRY AND SUGAR

\$150,000,000 Going Abroad Annually for This Staple Should Remain at Home. IT WOULD ENHANCE GENERAL PROSPERITY. Cogent Reasons Why Nebraska Should Give Its Liberal Bounty to the Home Producer.

CHAPMAN, Neb., Feb. 19.—To the Editor of The Bee: To the foolish talk and the combined blather of the World-Herald and the free trade papers against the sugar industry.

Concerning all this, I have to say to the free trade crank, it is not the duty of the state and the people to give attention to raising the products which we now import from foreign countries.

The total consumption of sugar in the entire United States in 1921 was 2,024,648 tons, of which three came from Cuba 1,005,761 tons; from Mexico 1,492,000 tons; from the West Indies, 45,347 tons; Brazil, 87,646 tons; East Indies, 135,824 tons; Sandwich islands, 120,845 tons; European countries, 16,200 tons; 15,137 tons; the total imported being 1,804,866 tons, while only 305,800 tons were produced in the United States.
