When John A. Walters, the army veteran who committed suicide in a room in the Windsor hotel on February 21, wrote to one of his wives that she shared the honor of being Mrs. Walters with a number of other women, undoubtedly he told the truth, though if the tale told yesterday by a lady from Papillion deserves credence he was not given o making mistakes of that kind. It will be remembered that a couple of days after the death of Walters a woman came from St. Joseph, Mo., exhibited four army discharges which Walters had given her, and proposed to apply for a pension as the lawful widow of the deceased. Her marriage certificate was dated January 23, 1894, however, while a recent act of congress provides that a woman vho marries a veteran after June 27, 1890, is not entitled to receive a pension after his death. She was informed of this by Dr. Stone, to whom she applied, but she held

n to her papers and returned to St. Joseph. On March 6 Dr. Stone received a long etter from a woman living in Harrisburg, Pa., stating that she was the first and legal wife of the much-married veteran, and inquiring after the discharge papers which she supposed were on his person, but which he had given to the Mrs. Walters of St. Joseph.
