He was the Only Support of His Own Two Resolutions. CHARGED WITH BUNCUMBE BY THE MAYOR.

At the regular meeting of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners, last night Mayor Bond was the only supporter of Strickler's anti-prostitution resolution.
