Dr. Drouth Reports Scarced the Wheat Shortage Yesterday. THAT CEREAL SHOWED MUCH STRENGTH

Corn Was Fairly Active for the Near-Months, but a Fraction Higher for the Remote.

CHICAGO, Oct. 24.—Dr. Drouth reports that the wheat market today, and December closed 3/4 higher. May corn gained 1/4, but oats 1/4 and provisions made slight advances.

Wheat showed decided strength. Trade was not active, but the moderate offerings were readily absorbed. The principal factor was the continued dry weather, there has been no rain of consequence yet, and little sign of any. Damage dispatches began to come in, and it seems probable that they will increase, both in number and seriousness, until the situation is relieved by moisture.

Provisions averaged a shade firmer and higher on a quiet moderate amount of business. Corn was fairer active for the near month and a fraction higher for the remote. Still a good deal of covering by shorts, and a continuation of the fractionally higher market, and with only moderate receipts and the strength in firmness was the rule.
