There Was Hardly Any Business on the Board.

CORN WAS INACTIVE AND FEATURELESS

Oats Held Very Steady and Without Hardly Any Business—News Reports Were Limited.

CHICAGO. Nov. 26.—There was hardly any business on the board, as wires were all down, and there was nothing in the way of news in base operations on. There was not a wire working in any direction at the opening of business and it was an hour or two before any communication was received from the market. Then the Kansas City wire got in shape and Milwaukee and St. Louis followed, but these brought little of importance in the way of news. Up to noon nothing had been heard from the seaboard, and the trade was in ignorance as to the condition of foreign markets and as to the condition of the market. There was no much interest centered in either. There was an unofficial report yesterday that they had been 9,000,000 bushels, but the trade was hoping to have this enormous amount reduced by report today. As a result, whatever trade existed was conducted without any reference to current news and wholly on the individual opinions of the dealers.

May kept narrow all day and sold at from \$6 to \$6 1/2 and December at from \$6 1/2 to \$6 3/4. The market was very inactive, but had a little spark on the better cables and May sold at from \$6 1/2 to \$6 3/4 split, and December at \$6 1/2, but was off to \$6 1/2 and from \$6 1/2 to \$6 1/4. May closed at \$6 1/2.

Corn was inactive and featureless, the trade being hampered by the same reasons which kept wheat steady. The few early reports were of little value.

The market was weaker during the last hour and May fell from \$6 21/2 to \$6 1/2 and November at 27 cents, only off to split.

Oats held very steady and with hardly any business. May sold at 29 cents and April from \$29 to \$29 1/2.

Hog prices were slow; May sold at from \$30 to \$30 1/2; June, \$30 1/2; July, \$30 1/2.

Condition of Trade and Quotations on Staple and Fancy Produce.

So far the Thanksgiving trade in the line of produce has been rather quiet and uneventful. The first of the week buyers were holding off and were not placing their orders, there being a feeling that a heavy run would materialize that would reduce prices. On the other hand, receivers and shippers were referring to the fact that less than 100,000 bushels had not accepted that price yet. Yesterday, the day when the bulk of the buying is supposed to be done, found the market very poorly supplied with turkeys. The receipts came straggling in all day, but the market was still rather quiet.
