The former foreign outlook at first exercised a powerful influence, but as later news was more specific the markets returned more to ordinary influences and eased off.

Wheat opened irregularly at from 65 1/2 to 66 1/2, a loss of 1/2 cent compared with last week. It held its strength better and closed 1/2 cent higher at 65 1/2, while oats lost its early gain and closed practically unchanged at 19 1/2.
