Considerable Anxiety Exhibited Among the Wheat Traders.

ON THE WHOLE IT WAS STEADY TO FIRM

Corn Traders Had a Dull Experience and Provisions Were Firm and Fairly Active, but Trade Was Confined to Pork.

CHICAGO, April 10.—Anxiety as to what percentage of a full condition for wheat would be given out by the government caused a dull day in wheat. May crop was slightly higher than yesterday. Corn closed with a gain of 1c, oats gained 1c, park closed with a gain of 1c, while lard and lard each lost 1c.

The feeling developed in wheat was rather mixed, but the tone was on the whole steady to firm. Initial transactions were at 3c to 5c advanced, but lard, 1c rallied slightly, while pork, little and short-term. The higher opening was due to some extent to the rather firm tone of cables, Liverpool coming unchanged, and then the northwestern receipts were rather small and imparted some strength to the situation. Commission houses were buyers, having no particular interest in wheat, which market ruled quite firm professionals taking moderate quantities also. There were large offerings as the session advanced, the weak position of the market being the foregoing. The fact that California had rains all over the state, with warm showers in the interior, was a factor in the more predicted added to the bearish reaction.

Corn traders had another dull experience. There were no outwards orders in the market and local operators were indifferent. Oats opened active, attracted considerable attention, but the day's trading was in the way of exchanging May for July at 3c premium for the latter. The firmness was entirely independent of rain, however, the quantity of corn still and good demand for the same. May opened a shade higher at 19c, sold to from 19c to 19½c and closed with sellers at 19c to 19½c.

Provisions were firm and fairly active, but the trade was rather quiet. Receipts came out of port. Receipts appeared to be a nervous short interest in the latter and it took only the buying of small lots to move the market. Lard and lard, without benefit to some extent by the strength in pork, both closed at a slight decline in price.

Estimated receipts for tomorrow are: Wheat, 20 cars; corn, 170 cars; oats, 150 cars; hogs, 100 cars.
