Omaha & Grant Smelter and Refining Company Establishes a Branch.

PURCHASES PILOT BAY SMELTING PLANT

Statement from Local Officers Allege this Action is Secessitated by High Duties in New Tariff Law.

The Omaha & Grant Smelter and Refining company of this city has just come into posession of the Pilot Bay Smelting plant on Kootenay bay, British Columbia. The deal is a most important one. It is announced that the purchasers will soon increase the capacity of the newly acquired smelter by the addition of two copper and lead stacks.

The Omaha & Grant company made a proposition for the purchase of the Pilot Bay Smelting plant some time ago. The proposition was accepted by the owners of the latter plant the fore part of the week, William Braden representing the Omaha com-pany in the negotiations. The deal is eaid to mean the establishment of one of the largest smelters in America in the Kootenay district.

The plant will be operated as a custom smelter for the treating of Slocan and Ross-land ores. This company has heretofore treated most of the Slocan ores at its eastern smelters. For some time past the com-pany has had representatives in the field pany has had representatives in the held securing contracts of ore from both the Slocan and Rossland camp, in anticipation of this purpose, and it is said they have succeeded in closing contracts with a ma-jority of the shipping aimes in both dis-tricts. The Pilot Bay omelier was first started by Dr. Hendrix, but before its com-pletten be turned the project over to his pletion he turned the project over to his brother, who finished the plant and operated it for about a year, since which it has been

"For quite a long time negotiations look-ing to the purchase of the Pilot Bay smelter have been going on, but definite action was not taken until it seemed possible that congress would impose an exorbitant duty on lead ore. This company was forced to make a similar move in 1893, when the same high rate of duty on one of its principal raw materials compelled Messrs, Barton and Nash to erect a large plant in Mexico, involving nearly \$506,000. Since then the ores in British Columbia have become prominent for fluxing purposes with American smelters, and great quantities have been imported. The Omaha company has had a large share of this output, paying nearly \$60,000 in duties at the Omaha customs house last year. They have been earnest in protesting against the high rate of duty which the Dingley-Aldrich bill is about to imprese, have a Weshington severe ing had a representative at Washington several weeks for that purpose. Hoar, in connection with which the original bill was drawn up. It is one of the most remarkable documents ever placed among the dusty files of any state house. It purports to be signed by about thirty-five undomesticated song birds, and is light and graceful and totally different from Senator Hoar's usual Titanic thunderbolt style. Here it is in full:

"To the Great and General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts—We, the song birds of Massachusetts and their playfellows, make this our humble petition. We know more about you than you think we do. We know how good you are. We have hopped about the roofs and looked in at your windows of the houses you have built for poor and sick and hungry people and latte lores and deaf and hungry people and your windows of the houses you have built for poor and sick and hungry people and little lame and deaf and blind children. We have built our nests in the trees and sung many a song as we flew about the gardens and parks you have made so beautiful for your children, especially your poor children, to play in.
