WATER IN EXPOSITION MAINS

Pipes on the Grounds Are Finally Filled with Fluid.

Difficulties in the Way of Making a Connection Over and Under the Pressure Trench on at Midnight.

The water mains on the exposition grounds are now connected with the mains of the Omaha Water company and the buildings on the grounds are protected against danger from fire.

The next step will be to make connections with the bluff tract. This portion of the grounds has been supplied through an inch pipe with water for construction purposes.
