## COMMERCIAL AND FINANCIAL

May Wheat Shows an Advance on Leiter's Buying.

## OTHER WHEAT PRICES ARE UNCHANGED

Corn Closes Lower, Oats Make an Advance, and Provisions Show a Slight Improvement in Price

**CHICAGO**, March 21.—With the exception of May the closing prices of wheat today, compared with Saturday's close, showed very little change. July closed 1c lower, all advance from frost in the winter wheat being lost under late realization. Leiter was a buyer of May and that future was strong closing 1c higher. Corn was firm most of the time, but closed 1c lower. Oats advanced 1c. Provisions were very dull, but the tendency was toward an improvement in price slight advances being recorded.

Wheat opened with a continuation of the weakness which marked the closing on Saturday, July starting about 4c lower at \$4.04/cwt. Perhaps the chief element of weakness lay in the large imports, estimates of which weakened the market Saturday, far overran expectations, 39 cars being reported, of which number 92 were of contract grade. Besides this 62 cars came from the mixing houses, a total addition to the central stocks of 101 cars, 100 more than Michigan and Duluth reported arrivals of 47 cars, against 44 last week and 31 a year ago. Liverpool showed 5d decline at the opening, and foreign wheat in the early weakness. Liquidation which started at the opening soon stopped.

The weather in the northwest, and predicted cold weather for the west, which in view of the recent rains, and the timely appearance among shorts and soon turned the market from weakness to strength. In side of the first thirty minutes trading July advanced to \$4.05 per bushel, nearly 1c higher, while others were still in play.
