CHICAGO, July 6.—Crop damage reports, together with an urgent demand for cash wheat by millers, strengthened wheat today.

Continued weather, however, Liverpool cables and the general bullish sentiment of the trade started wheat easy.

Unfavorable crop news and an improved cash demand were the main influences in wheat.
