AS TO TERMS OF PEACE. It is probable that the Washington administration, in view of the possibility that Spain may at any time sue for peace, has considered the terms which this government will propose for ending the war.

The question as to terms of peace has, however, received some attention in the press and is being thought about by the people. It is a matter that has more or less interest for European statesmen. What is absolutely settled in the public mind of America is the complete expulsion of Spain from the western hemisphere.

To drive the Spaniard out of Cuba and leave him in control of Porto Rico would be regarded with extreme disfavor by practically the entire American people. It is true that in going to war it was declared to be the sole object of the United States to free Cuba and to enable the people of the island to establish an independent government there.

Such being settled, there remains the perplexing question as to what terms shall be made in regard to other territory already wrested or that may be wrested from Spain. The Ladrones islands are in undisputed possession of the United States, the Philippines are certain to be if they are not already within sixty days, if Spain should stubbornly persist in hostilities that length of time, we shall probably be in possession of more of her territory.

Spain may seek, through peace negotiations, to recover some of her lost territory, but she cannot reasonably hope to do so. The annexation of such territory to the United States would be the gravest possible mistake. The wisest and best solution of the problem will be found in allowing the people of Porto Rico and the Philippines to erect an independent government, republican in form. Such a policy would be consonant with American principles and would vindicate the sincerity of the assurance we gave the world when we went to war.

Doubtless a considerable number of Americans are contemplating going to Hawaii, impressed with the idea that as soon as the islands are formally annexed there will spring up a demand for various kinds of labor there and that all kinds of work will be well paid, particularly the better class of work which Americans are capable of doing.
