ARMY AND NAVY RETIREMENT.

Law Will Work Important Changes in Personnel in the Near Future.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 7.-Many important changes will occur in the army and navy during the remaining months of the present year.

These are due to the natural course of events and are in no wise the result of the war with Spain.

Two army officers who will retire next year are General William M. Graham, now in command of the Second army corps in camp at Middleburg, Pa., and Major General J. C. Copinger, in command of the Fourth army corps with headquarters at Huntsville, Ala.

The two admirals who will retire this year are Admiral M. Searl, recently president of the Naval Board, and now president of the Examining and Retiring boards, who retires October 24; Admiral Joseph N. Miller, the ranking officer of the navy, now in command of the Pacific station, who retires November 21; and Admiral F. N. Hines, commandant of the New York navy yard, who retires September 25.

The principal heroes of the Spanish war retire in the following order: Admiral George Dewey, commanding the Asiatic station, December 1, 1895; Admiral J. S. Schley, on the Porto Rico expedition, commission, October, 1901, and Admiral W. T. Sampson, on the Cuban evacuation commission, February, 1902.

NEEDLES FOR THE WORLD. An American Plant to Compete with the English Makers.

Pittsburg proposes to enter into competition with Worcester, England, and other cities, says the Pittsburg Dispatch, and at the same time into the United States, on a much larger and more modern scale than that of English plants, enabling the iron city to compete easily with European factories that have thus far maintained a monopoly of the world's output.

The company is to be known as the American Needle company and it is the intention to have at least three plants in the United States, with an aggregate capacity almost double that of the old world factories.

All grades, from the delicate cambric needed to the huge darning and sailors' needles, will be turned out. The steel needle was first shown to the world at Nuremberg at the close of the fourteenth century.
