General Greely Tells of the Sensation with Men Dropping Dead Each Day. "The new year of 1884 was only nineteen days old when death came for the first time," writes General A. W. Greely in the Ladies' Home Journal, telling for the first time the awful experiences of his Arctic exploring party at Cape Sabine. "For ninety days we had all lived and kept together. And now we felt that we were all awaiting the summons, one by one. We scarcely looked at each other.
