GREAT WESTERN WILL COME

Stickney's Road is Said to Be Sorely Headed Toward Council Bluffs.

EXTENSION WILL BE BUILT NEXT YEAR

Of the Two Routes Already Surveyed the South Will Be Chosen as It is the Shorter of the Two.

Local railroad men were discussing yesterday the report that the long-talked-of extension of the Great Western into Council Bluffs will be positively built next year.

The report that reached here was to the effect that President Stickney and other officers of the road have given it out that the extension will undoubtedly be built and that what has commonly been designated the southern route will be the one followed.

The Great Western has had this extension under consideration for the last four years and has made two surveys, one known as the north and the other as the south route. Several parties of surveyors were at work in the vicinity of Council Bluffs last winter and no less than four surveys were made for an entrance into the city.

The south route, which it is said the company will now follow, was surveyed from Conger and from East Perry, south of Des Moines, west through Winterset, Greenfield, Cumberland, Griswold and Carson into Council Bluffs.

It is stated that the north route has been abandoned because of the building of the Fort Dodge & Omaha and branches of the Northwestern through the territory that the Great Western had proposed to occupy.

The character of the country along the south route is rough and the cost of construction per mile of the road will be much greater than if the north route was followed, but the reduction in mileage will make the aggregate cost considerably less than if the line were built over the better route.

It is also stated that the Great Western has decided to extend its line from Hampton through Wright, Humboldt, Pocahontas, Buena Vista and Woodbury counties into Sioux City, crossing the Fort Dodge & Omaha road at Storm Lake.

INCREASE OF ACTUAL VALUE

Iowa State Board of Review Completes Equalization of Assessments. TOTAL AMOUNT REACHES \$397,000,000

Twenty-One Counties Raised and Four Decreased—Increase in Savings Bank Deposits—Claim Against Government.

DES MOINES, July 27.—(Special Telegram.)—The State Board of Review today completed the equalization of the assessment made by counties of the real estate of Iowa.

Increased—Allamakee, Decatur, Madison, Marion, Wayne, 3 per cent; Appanoose, Des Moines, Clarke, Iowa, Keokuk, Lucas, Mahoning, Monroe, Montgomery, Palo Alto, Taylor, 5 per cent; Davis, Harrison, Jefferson, 7 per cent; Waelo, 8 per cent.

Tenth Senatorial District Republicans Meet at Pomeroy and Renominate Present Incumbent.

PORT DODGE, Ia., July 27.—(Special Telegram.)—The senatorial convention of the Tenth district, including Webster and Calhoun counties, met at Pomeroy this afternoon for the purpose of nominating a republican candidate for senator.

Senator Healy was renominated by acclamation. The spiritlike silence which pervaded all authoritative and significant sources of information from the Tenth district was preserved. Except in the speech by Senator Healy the name of Hon. H. J. Dolliver was not mentioned in the convention.
