

SHOWING OF UNION PACIFIC

Annual Report of Consolidated Companies is Made Public.

REMARKABLE EVIDENCE OF PROSPERITY

Surplus for Year Ending June 30, 1899, Exceeds \$8,000,000—Dividends on Common Stock Reach Nearly 5 Per Cent.

The annual report of the Union Pacific railroad for the year ending June 30, 1899, has just been made public. Although appearing six months after the close of the year covered by the report it is of unusual interest in railroad circles.

With a mileage of 5,399 miles the combined results of the operations of the three companies are as follows:

Surplus for the year ending June 30, 1899, is \$8,543,812. It is apparent from the surplus shown that the surplus of the subsidiary companies and the "other income" of the Union Pacific, received as dividends on its holdings of stock in those companies.

The report shows that the authorized capital stock of the Union Pacific company is now \$100,000,000 preferred and \$96,178,800 common.

percentage 51. Of hogs Kansas City received 2,593,673 head and packed 2,760,109, the percentage being 51. Sheep receipts were 353,211 and 445,212 head were slaughtered, the percentage being 68. Of the total receipts the percentage packed is 74. Chicago packed 68 per cent of its cattle receipts, 80 per cent of hogs and 90 per cent of sheep. Chicago's total percentage is 84. As South Omaha's total percentage is 84, it is readily seen that this market is equal to Chicago in the percentage of total receipts slaughtered and 10 per cent ahead of Kansas City.
