Visiting my old home at Earlville, LaSalle ounty, Ill., I was very much interested in the change of the last twenty-eight years in the orchards, groves, methods of farming and in our old home place. One thing that which trees have grown in twenty-eight years' time-avenues of street trees, shade

We find people cuttting down cottonwoods that have grown to a diameter of three feet and some of them even larger. Timber lands have been cleared up and are now growing fine crops of corn. The school yard of the district where I

Most of the farm houses are well painted. nearly all of the farmers have large barns. The orchards, however, have gone to wreck and the orchard, which was so productive for us thirty years ago, now has but few trees

extreme care taken in all of the operations of farming. I am told that the present method of growing corn is to plow from six to seven inches deep, using gang plows and four horses; to thoroughly disc, then follow this with some kind of pulverizer. One familiarly called the "Tower pulverizer" is most used. This is a combination of surface working knives and clod crusher, used with four good horses, cutting eight feet in width. Skillful farmers remark that they like to give the corn a considerable portion of its cultivation before planting; or in other words, thorough and careful preparation


