

CHANGE DEPOTS THIS MONTH

Missouri Pacific Will Begin Use of Union Station April 29.

ARRANGEMENTS PRACTICALLY PERFECTED

General Manager Harding and Associates Reach Satisfactory Agreement in Conference with Union Pacific Officials.

The Missouri Pacific will begin the use of the Union Pacific passenger station in this city for its through St. Louis passenger trains Sunday, April 29.

The Missouri Pacific officials have not yet reached a decision relative to the depot facilities for their Auburn local train. It is believed, however, that this train will also use the accommodations afforded by the union station, although the Webster street depot may be continued.

The change in depots for the through train service will necessitate a revised time card, to become effective April 29. By entering and departing from the Omaha Union station and using the Union Pacific tracks between Omaha and South Omaha the time of the Missouri Pacific trains will be shortened approximately a half hour.

MAY LOWER FREIGHT RATES.

Western Trunk Line Committee Will Consider Proposed Reductions.

The recently that has prevailed in freight circles for weeks past promises to be somewhat disturbed in the next few days.

Among other questions to be considered is a proposition to apply the third class rate on candy and confectionery in less than carload quantities.

Another question to be considered by the committee has arisen from the lowering of the Omaha-Kansas City differential on packing house product shipments to the south-east.

Morgan & Co. authorized the statement that the Southern Railway company is negotiating for the acquisition of the Louisville, Evansville & St. Louis Air line and a plan for the reorganization of that company will be issued based on an agreement by the Southern railway to take over the property after reorganization.

Augustus Frank Makes His Exit Through a Door of Poison.

DESPONDENCY DRIVES HIM TO THE DEED

Death of a Beloved Child, Coupled with Financial Reverses, Believed to Have Caused Him to Commit the Act.

Rigid, with the arms drawn back in an attitude of defense, the dead body of Augustus Frank was taken from a bed in room 83 of the Paxton hotel at 9 o'clock yesterday morning.

Frank was about 42 years old and a land dealer. Despondency over the death of a beloved child or financial reverses, or both, resulted in excessive drinking, followed, as it seems, by the use of a deadly drug. The relatives at Kearney, Neb., were notified by wire.

Frank registered at the hotel four days ago. It was 8 o'clock before he retired Sunday morning. At noon a chambermaid knocked at the door of room 83, listened a minute, heard deep snoring and went away.

FOR FLEECING THOUSANDS

Get-Rich-Quick Miller Convicted of Grand Larceny by New York Jury—Verdict Dazed Him.

NEW YORK, April 16.—William F. Miller of Franklin, Indiana, fame was found guilty tonight of grand larceny in the first degree for taking from Mrs. Katharine Moser \$1,000 which she invested in his 120 per cent scheme "to get rich quick."

Miller was sentenced to a term of one year in the state prison. He was also fined \$1,000 and costs.
