THREE GREAT RACES TODAY

Cornell, Columbia, W. Mass., Georgetown and Pennsylvania to Bow.

CORNELL FAVORITE IN BIG VARSITY EVENT

Pennsylvania Chosen to Win Four-Oared Crew, While Wisconsin Freshmen Are Thought to Have Good Chance.

POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., June 29.—The program for the college boat races tomorrow is as follows: 4 Oared—University four-oared shell without coxswain, distance two miles. Entries: Cornell, Columbia, Cornell and Pennsylvania. Favorite tonight, Pennsylvania.

6 Oared—Freshmen eight-oared shell, distance two miles. Entries: Columbia, Cornell, Cornell and Pennsylvania. Favorite tonight, Wisconsin.

8 Oared—University eight-oared shell, distance four miles. Entries: Cornell, Cornell, Pennsylvania, Georgetown and Wisconsin. Favorite tonight, Cornell, with Wisconsin and Pennsylvania almost equally backed.

Probable condition of the water from observations is as follows: For the entire afternoon after the six mile sets in, which is about 7 o'clock, smooth water with a light wind from the north. When the first race is called the tide will be of little advantage, but for the second race there will be a good ebb, by 8 o'clock, when the "Varsity race" is to row, there will be a good ebb and with the aid of the wind records should be made.

A feature of this year's regatta is the fact that in each and every event a trophy is to be awarded to the winning crew.

In addition to this prize there is offered this year for the first time a trophy in each of the three two-oared events. In the university four-oared race it is the Kennedy challenge trophy, presented by Davidson Kennedy, University of Pennsylvania, to be held by the winner for one year.

In the freshman race the premium is called the Edwards cup, presented by Francis S. Edwards, Cornell University, and it also to be held by the winner for one year. Of the two races rowed here in four years Cornell has won seven, Yale one and Pennsylvania two. There is not much betting as usual on the eve of a great race, especially when the chance of a college is involved in the decision, it takes time to consider. There is no public betting gang at tonight, and there will probably be none tomorrow. The afternoon practices today developed practically nothing new.

Ellis Ward took the Pennsylvania crew and gave the two eights starts and signals and will be allowed the four-oared crew to row where it pleased.
