## Started It with a Hot One.

In the very first act the visitors set the Rourke boys a hot pace. After two men had been retired, "Peaches" Kling poked out a double, which might have been grabbed up by Eddie Lauzon, but it wasn't. Then dapper Jack Grinn signalized his appearance in Omaha after many years' absence by swatting a hot one down the third base line, permitting Kling to cross the bag. Grinn followed on Schall's customary three-bagger, but the latter's effort went no further, for Baer retired the side-on an easy one down to Baird at second and found his old captain waiting for him with the glad mitt at the initial corner. In the half-inning when Jimmy Tamm did start with a safety, the Saints were awarded a home collar. The Saints got the same dose in first half of the second, but it was different with the Colts. With Baird safely anchored on first by virtue of a hot liner through the center of the diamond and two men out, Jimmy Hoy utilized his last swing by landing for a three-bagger and Baird capered over the plate. Coons nipped Hoy's scoring aspirations in the bud by striking out.

Once again in the third the Saints copped out a large luscious goose egg, but Mattie McVicker's usual home run tilted up the score on the right side of the ledger and balanced the account for the time being. After that it was a succession of ciphers for the Rourke family, while the Saints kept up the gait to the tune of one in the fourth, two in the fifth and the last in the seventh, making in all an even half dozen.
