INSPECTUR STOPS REPAIRS

Agent of a Farnam Street Building Fails to Secure the Necesaary Permit.

The agent of the building at 1314 Farnam street has run against the city building inspector and has come out slightly battered the impact. The building at that number is one of the oldest structures in that part of the city. It is of frame and for years has been a standing menace to property in that locality. 
