SOMEONE TO SAVE PETTIGREW

South Dakota Fusionists Appeal in Va for Help in Their District.

SIoux FALLS, S. D., Oct. 14 (Special).—Since the republican national committee announced that Senators Hanna and Frye were to spend two or three days in South Dakota, the fusionists of this state have with a great demonstration at Sioux Falls next Thursday evening, there has been considerable interest in the fusionists. The wires between this city and democratic headquarters in Chicago were kept hot for several days. The New York committee for this prominent democratic leader was arranged to be in the city to get some demonstration of prominence to follow Senator Hanna and Frye to offset the good it is recognized they will do for the cause of republicanism. The call was sent forth for David B. Hill and a strong demand was made on the democratic national committee for this prominent democratic leader. The local committee was repulsed and a few days ago a second demand for Hill was made, the national committee being informed that it was necessary to have him in order to save the republican party. The fusionists have no particular interest in the South Dakota state senator. It is remembered that David B. Hill, while in the United States senate, tanned the hide of Pettigrew in a couple of occasions on the floor of the senate. One day he said, "I said, a square refusal was received from the democratic national committee. The message contained the information that Mr. Hill would come no further west than Chicago. This last message is said to have caused considerable sorrow in the camp of the fusionists and it is proposed to work attempting to secure some plan by which they can repair their fences after being damaged by the visit of Senators Hanna and Frye. It is understood that arrangements will be made to have Senator Pettigrew camp on the railway on the senators from Ohio and Maine. In other words, Senator Pettigrew is to make a flying trip over the state and cover the same territory covered by Senators Hanna and Frye.

For Hanna and Frye.

HERON, S. D., Oct. 14 (Special).—A well attended meeting of the McKinley club held last night at the Commercial hotel, and a grand demonstration was held on Wednesday, October 17, when Chairman Mark Hanna of the national republican committee is to deliver a speech. He will be accompanied by Senator Frye of Maine, who will also be speaking on the platform of a republican standpoint. It is proposed to have a torchlight procession, transparencies, fireworks, etc., and make the occasion of his visit by these famous men a red-letter day for republicans in this locality. A number of meetings have been held to hold a demonstration on the 17th and have been called off in order to give speakers and people an opportunity to see and hear Chairman Hanna and Senator Frye. Their coming is the topic of discussion in all quarters, both by republicans and fusionists. The amount of money to be raised for a grand demonstration on the 17th will be here a settled fact. Colonel Geddis, chairman of the county central committee, is in receipt of many letters saying delegations from neighboring towns will be present and to make room for them in the big parade.

Wool Clip at Casper.

CASPER, Wyo., Oct. 14 (Special).—The wool clip in this territory, known as the Casper clip, during the season was 1,800,000 pounds. The amount of 1,730,000 pounds have been shipped and 1,065,710 pounds remain in storage here. The wool, as produced by districts in the Casper country, is as follows: Salt Creek, 385,511 pounds; Welter, 178,000 pounds; Oak Oak, 337,250 pounds; Thermopsis, 164,100 pounds; Buck Camp, 11,840 pounds; Lander, 600,836 pounds; Red Bank, 245,500 pounds; Muskrat, 235,465 pounds; points near Casper, 529,263 pounds; Casper, 1,571,422 pounds. The amount of wool in the Casper country in 1899 was 4,107,800 pounds, showing an increase for 1900 of 1,394,767 pounds.
