WOMEN NEED NOT REGISTER

May Vote for School Board Members Without that Formality.

CANNOT VOTE ON BOND PROPOSITION

in Statute Anent Registration Does Not Apply to Women in the City

of Omaha.

In the opinion of City Attorney W. J. Connell women who desire to vote for members of the Board of Education at the coming election need not register. In fact, Mr. Convell holds that women cannot register legally in a city of the metropolitan class beforth the school laws for metropolitan cities provide that women are entitled to a vote for members of the Board of Education after swearing that they are 21 years of age, that they have been in the district forty days and that they either pay taxes or have chitdren of school age. The law specifically states that women shall vote only for members of the school board and Mr. Council says that they cannot be permitted to vote on the High school bond proposition to be

submitted at the coming election. Confusion concerning the registration of women was brought about by an amendment to section No. 4 under subdivision No. 2 of the school laws of Nebraska. This section applies, in the opinion of the city attorney. to school districts other than those in metropolitan cities. The amendment is as for-lows: "All electors in school elections in cities where registration of voters is required shall comply with the provisions of such registration law before they shall be

entitled to vote." Although Mr. Connell admits that the author of this amendment may have intended that it should require the registration of women voters in Omaha he says that it does not apply to Omaha because it is not included under the subdivision prepared especially for the regulation of school elections in cities of more than 100,000 popula-

tion At the last school election this same question was in dispute and there were many arguments presented on both sides. The result of the agitation was that all women who were entitled to a vote exercised the franchise regardless of registration. Mr. Con-nell expressed at that time the same epinion which he holds now and says that many attorneys who formerly contended for the registration of women now accept his interpretation of the law and agree that the amendment was not made to the right subdivision of the school law to be effective in Omaha.
