SUES SENATOR FOR DAMAGES

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26.—A suit for \$20,000 damages for breach of promise against United States Senator William V. Sullivan of Mississippi, was filed in the District of Columbia supreme court this afternoon by Mal Lester of Oxford, Miss. The plaintiff, in her affidavit, alleges that she, an unmarried woman, bore the name of Mal Lester and was betrothed to marry the plaintiff, which she, without cause or right, has refused to do. The plaintiff claims that she met Senator Sullivan about October 7, 1900, in his law office at Oxford, Miss. He being employed in that office at that time, she claims that he made professions of affection for her "made begun by wiles and artifices to induce the plaintiff to accompany him on a journey to Chattanooga, Tenn.
