Burlington Will Put on Rapid Service from Chicago to Billings.

ST. PAUL-FORTLAND TRAIN DISCONTINUED

Northern Pacific Contracts Its Service and Coast Mail from the East Will Now Pass Through Nebraska.

Another fast mail train from Chicago to the Missouri river will be put into service next Sunday, when the Burlington will begin the operation of a train designed primarily for the purpose of carrying the bulk of mail matter destined to Montana and the northern part of the state...
