How the Weapon is Made.

All these instruments are made by hand. There are several bolo factories in Mindanao, mostly located in the interior of mountain towns.

Simple in design, and without ornamentation, it is primarily a weapon of war. Officially, the carrying of the bolo proper constitutes rank or position.

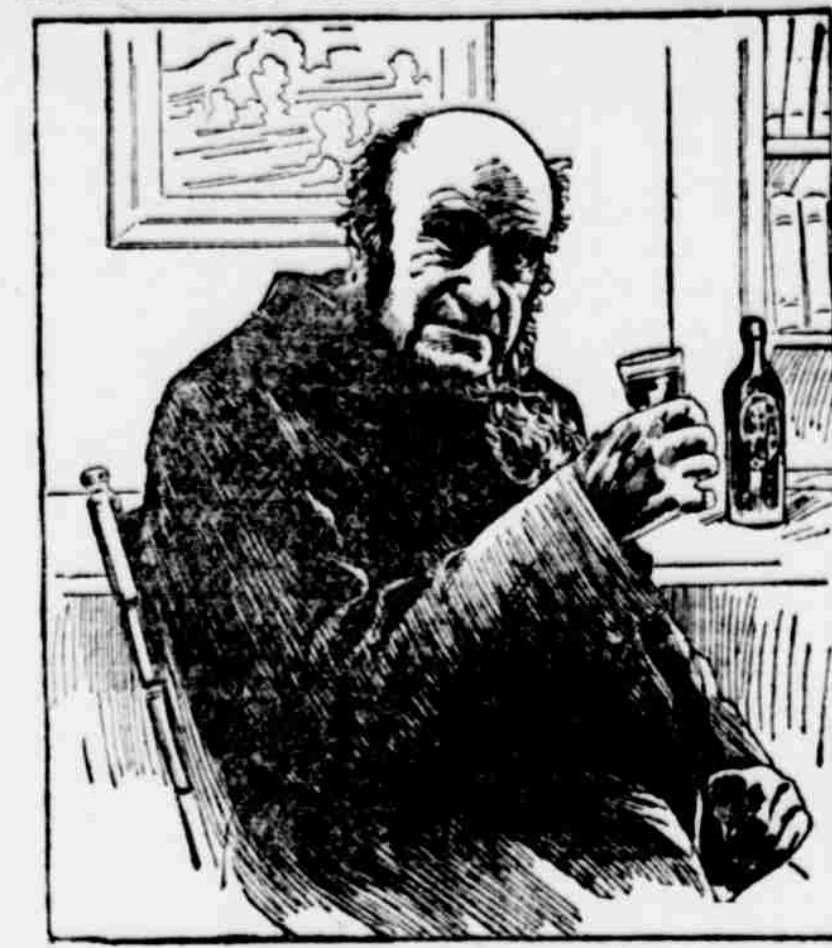

LABOR AND INDUSTRY.

The United States has sixty-five co-operative societies.

It will be shown by the new United States census that fully 1,000,000 married women are employed in factories.

Such a scarcity of sailors exists on the Pacific coast that vessels cannot leave port unless four deep are tied up to the docks awaiting men.

Common laborers in Spain get from 35 cents per day in the larger towns and from 20 to 25 cents in the rural districts.

The only factory in the country that turns out glass marbles has just been built at Southfield, Mich., and the production will be 150,000 per day.

Milwaukee's great crane, operated by electric power, built by the American Electric Works, will lift 200 tons and will be operated on a track fifty-six feet long.

At Newport News, Va., during the time constituting a working day, 157,273 tons of coal were shipped from the Chesapeake and Ohio coal piers into the vessels waiting to receive it.

Permy made the first steel pens at Birmingham in 1824, selling them at 30 cents apiece. The weekly output of that city today is 2,000,000, and some are sold for 5 cents a gross.

One of the Chicago building contractors is so busy that he has had to employ 120 men to assist him in that city has lost twelve jobs in St. Paul, Minn., because the men refused to work on buildings which are to be erected on a way connected with the work.

Two hundred unions connected with the New York Employment, Educational and Home association have decided to erect a new building on the site of the old one, which will cost \$200,000. The new temple will have a floor space of 1,000,000 square feet.

Typographical union No. 5 of New York was asked by Comptroller Cook recently to contribute \$100,000 to the city of New York for the purpose of erecting a new municipal printing plant. The union answered that it would contribute \$100,000, and the building for the plant about \$200,000, or \$300,000 for building and outfitting.

The estimated steel rail equipment for 1900 is 2,100,000 tons, and the orders for this equipment are as follows: Pennsylvania, 1,000,000 tons; New York, 1,000,000 tons; and other states, 1,000,000 tons.

Of the total exports of the United States in 1899 only 10 per cent went to the countries of the western hemisphere, and of that 10 per cent only 5 per cent went to the United States. Although we buy more of Brazil's staples—coffee and rubber—than all Europe combined, five other nations excel us in exports to Brazilian markets.

South Carolina negroes have started a new industry by the hand-picking of phosphate rock. During the summer they anchor boats on the Coosaw river, which is from seventeen to twenty-five feet deep, and dig for the fertilizing rock, returning with a fragment weighing 10 pounds. The phosphate from the river bed is the most valuable known.

At Chicago Judge Grosscup has decided an interesting case as arbitrator for the Bricklayers union and Masons' and Builders' association. When the lockout was declared in February, an agreement was made by the union but only served four years and two months of his five years term. The employer refused to pay him wages, although he was under contract to furnish steady employment, or do so. The controversy was referred to Andrew Linquist for the employer, Thomas J. Conroy for the union, and Judge Grosscup. The latter decided in favor of the boy and the employer must pay all back wages.
