May Wheat Declines on Weak Cables and Slack Cash Demand.

HEAVY RECEIPTS ARE ALSO A FACTOR

Corn's Susceptible Nature Also Gives Way and Its Price Drops Nearly a Half Cent-Days and Provisions Join Decline.

CHICAGO, Jan. 22.—Weak cables, heavy receipts and a slack cash demand caused a net decline of 10c⁰⁰ in May wheat today.

Corn closed 2c lower in sympathy and oats 4c⁰⁰ lower.

Provisions were also lower yesterday.

Wheat went up a cent yesterday.

The stuff bought in previous session was sold to jobbers; London prices closed at 71c²⁵ and was inactive and unchanged.
