



IMPORTANT CHANGES ARE CONTEMPLATED

Judge B. S. Baker Prepares Three Bills for

the Legislature.

Seeks to Close Technical Loopholes Through Which Burglars and Other Criminals Are Now Allowed to Escape.

Judge Ben S, Baker has drawn three bills for important amendments to the criminal code of Nebraska. He will have the bills introduced in the legislature within a few

days and will urge their passage. One bill has for its purpose the removal of the fine distinction in law between burglary and "breaking and entering in the taytime." As the statutes stand it is necessary to show that a house was broken into at nighttime in order to convict of burglary, and in many cases it is impossible to prove the exact time of the commission of the crime-whether it was before or after

suprise. Loophole for Escape.

Judge Baker is of the opinion that many burglars escape just punishment by the inability of the public prosecutors to convict them of anything but "breaking and entering in the daytime," and his bill proposes to do away with that definition altogether and make breaking and entering either in the day or nighttime burglary, with a penalty of not less than one year in the county jail or not more than ten years in the penitentiary. The wide range of the penalty is for the purpose of allowing the trial court to fix the punishment according to the

seriousness of the offense. The second bill is aimed at the growing class of young miscreants who enter vacant houses and carry away plumbing fixtures

and otherwise injure the property.

To Increase Penalty. Under the present laws this offense is lescribed as trespass and is punishable by light fine or inprisonment. The new bill makes the offense larceny and provides a punishment of not more than one year in

in the penitentiary. The present bribery laws of Nebraska apply only to ministerial and judicial officers and Judge Baker's third bill is designed to make them apply "to all public officers elected or appointed." The bill also provides that the offense shall be complete when any part of the bribery transaction, including the promise, is made within the
