DELAY IN THEIR ARRIVAL.

Soldier Boys from Havana Are Coming In Behind Time. Provisions of the New Army Bill Means Some Lively Times at Fort Crook During Reorganization.

The accident to the United States transport Rowlin, which was to have brought two battalions of the Tenth Infantry from Havana to New York, will delay the arrival of these troops at Fort Crook probably from two to five days.

Reorganization Is Contemplated. The two battalions of the Tenth Infantry which are now in the Philippines are now quartered at Fort Crook about three weeks or a month, during which time they will be entirely reorganized and supplied with new equipment.

CARMAN IS OUT FOR COIN. Trader Recently Arrested in Manila Is Known by Many Omaha People. D. H. Carman, who was arrested in Manila last week for furnishing supplies to the Filipinos, is well known to Omaha people who have visited the archipelago.

It was Carman who sold to the Greater America Exposition the carriage of Colonel Stotsenburg, which attracted great attention to the grounds at Omaha the year before last.

"Carman had bought the carriage from Mrs. Stotsenburg immediately after the death of the general at Omaha, which occurred the day I landed in Manila.

"It happened that Colonel Stotsenburg's old coachman, Boneta Maleg, the picturesque Filipino who subsequently took such delight in bringing his old master through the exposition grounds for the entertainment of the visitors, was with me when the carriage was delivered.

"The 'swell turn-out' in which Colonel Stotsenburg had been accustomed to drive through Manila had been completely transformed. To begin with, the leather side curtains and splasher had been entirely removed and the car had become missing in addition, the driver's box had been taken off and a cheap one had not properly fit the carriage had also been substituted for the original one.
