DECLARATIONS OF CUBAN CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION PRESENTED TO THE GOVERNOR

HAVANA, Feb. 28.—Senator Capin, president of the Cuban constitutional convention, at 2 o'clock this afternoon handed to Governor General Wood the declarations of the convention on the proposed relations between Cuba and the United States, as adopted yesterday afternoon. The presentation was informal and the remarks were made. General Wood has notified the authorities at Washington that the declarations will be translated into English and mailed to Washington.

W. J. Hayes & Sons, municipal bond buyers of Cleveland, O., have written to Clerk Shrigley, asking for histories of the sewer bonds in districts Nos. 108, 109 and 110. Mr. Shrigley immediately sent the histories by express and hopes to receive a favorable reply on the council ordering tracks laid in the eastern part of the city as one year is allowed in which to complete the work. It is understood that the motor people propose to extend the Thirteenth street line to South Omaha just as soon as conditions will warrant the expenditure, which is also being considered. The present quarters of the association on N street are not large enough and more room must be found. It is expected that a decision will be arrived at within a few days.

FEEDING PRISONERS' BILLS

A committee of the city council composed of Adkins, Johnston and Martin, waited upon the county commissioners yesterday afternoon for the purpose of checking over the bills of the county against the city for the detention and feeding of prisoners. The bill now rendered amounts to \$2,000 and the matter was thoroughly discussed. An objection was made by the house of representatives.

FIRE IN JEWELRY FACTORY

Fire, originating under a stairway in the rear of Jacob L. Jacobson's jewelry manufacturing establishment on the second floor of the Burlington building at 1511-1513 Dodge street, caused a damage of \$10,000 Thursday night. The cause is unknown. When the fire was discovered it had gained considerable headway but the department succeeded in putting out the fire to the jewelry shop and the damage to the building will not exceed \$100. Tools, machinery and fixtures of the jewelry establishment were damaged \$900.
