

FIREBUGS INFEST THE CITY

Frequent Incendiary Blazes of Thursday and Friday Night Being Investigated.

DETECTIVES LOOK FOR TORCH BEARERS

Police Department Joins with Fire Force to Stamp Out Reign of Terror in Walnut Hill District.

The police are attempting to solve the mystery of the three fires Friday night and the two of Thursday night. All of these are believed by members of the fire department to have been of incendiary origin.

This had been done the night before, when two mysterious fires occurred in Walnut Hill. After Friday night's fires the investigation began in earnest.

Chief Redell believes that the buildings, most of which were built of sheds with frames adjoining, were set on fire. At 10:02 Friday night came an alarm for a fire in a coalshed on the premises of J. Patrick, on Forty-second street between Franklin and Decatur streets.

Called Out Again. The Walnut Hill company had just returned to the company's house at Thirty-third and Broadway, when at 10:05 a fire broke out in the rear of 4028 Seward street, about two blocks to the southeast of the first one.

While at work with this fire the men saw the reflection from another fire across the tracks. It proved to be in the rear of a barn at 4145 Burdette street, one block west and six north of the fire where the men were at work.

THURSDAY NIGHT'S FIRES

On Thursday night fire was discovered in the Arctic Ice company's house at Thirtieth and Nichols streets and in a barn on the premises of Louis Goldsmith, 3429 Hamilton street.

In discussing the fires Chief Redell said that he has but little doubt that the buildings were fired. Although he has not made an investigation of the matter, he says that the reports of the firemen show the marks of incendiary in all five of the fires.

DEMAND FOR UMBRELLAS

City Engineer Rosewater Talks of the Presidential Inauguration.

"Washington was a sea of umbrellas the day of the inauguration. Early in the morning the weather was pleasant and then the rain came. It was impossible to enjoy the ceremonies because of the brigades of umbrella-carriers, who stood everywhere and shut out the view," said City Engineer Andrew Rosewater, who has just returned from Washington.

"One noticeable feature was the slight applause which greeted Admiral Dewey and General Miles. They rode together in the parade and the applause they called forth was very faint. Everywhere I heard people remark about the lack of enthusiasm over the naval hero.

"Dewey was a very striking figure. His large, gray moustache stood out in strange contrast to the gray uniform he wore. He resembles his picture so much that it cannot be said that the crowds failed to recognize him. Several Washington men remarked to me that they had occasionally seen the public has shown the same coldness toward the admiral which characterized the inauguration crowds.

"McKinley seemed to be the one man in whom everybody was interested. The rainy, disagreeable weather did not dampen the enthusiasm of the crowds sufficiently to prevent the president from receiving a rousing reception all along the line of march.

On his return from Washington Mr. Rosewater stopped in Chicago and had a consultation with City Electrician Ellicott concerning subways and the best plan for burying electric wires.

Mr. Ellicott tells me that in his opinion a city should own its own subways and be able to regulate wires. In many of the streets in Chicago various companies have constructed their own subways, and the streets are so thoroughly underlaid that it is almost impossible to dig up any additional ducts.

"By forcing all these companies to use a common subway repairs could be confined to a small portion of the street and the public would not be inconvenienced as caused by the continual tearing up and relaying of paving."

TAKES PART IN DISCUSSION

Superintendent Pearse Has His Say About Public School System.

Superintendent Pearse said when asked about the reported statement of a High school teacher concerning an entering class of forty first grade pupils, that he is hardly likely that a teacher made such a statement. She or he has probably been misquoted by some one in reporting what was said. If, however, any teacher made such a statement, I do not doubt that the same pupils could be taken after receiving her instruction in English and a test could be given them which would show results upon which quite as damaging statements could be based as those which were attributed to the teacher referred to.

"Teachers sometimes fall into the habit of criticizing pupils received from teachers in the grades below. Sometimes, of course, pupils are not as well prepared in some or all respects as they should be. It is certainly, however, that the best teachers are the ones least likely to make comment of this kind. Teachers of the eighth grade in Omaha are almost without exception well prepared to take pupils who do good, though work.

"Pupils who enter the High school find themselves in such different atmosphere and under such different conditions that they do not appear to advantage until they become accustomed to these new surroundings, new methods of work and new teachers. Until this feeling of newness and strangeness has worn off these pupils are easily discouraged, and by questioning them in a wide variety of these matters and they are accustomed to them, they are able to present accurate concerning things about which they were really well informed.

"A teacher who judged hastily or did not understand her pupils as well as she might would be inclined to conclude that they did not know the structure of an English sentence, or were deficient in some other important department of knowledge. High school teachers should be, and usually are, sensible and considerate in these matters and remember that college and university pupils often make the same criticisms upon pupils received from the High school that High school teachers are sometimes disposed to make upon pupils received from the grades below."
