

HORSES ARE BADLY WANTED

Famine May Cause a Change in War Department Plane.

ANOTHER CALL FOR BIDS IS ISSUED Lack of Horses Will Probably Delay Sending of Troops to the Phil-

inpines Intil Middle of

Summer.

On account of the horse famine, which was noted in The Bee last Saturday, the sending of the first battalion of the Fourteenth cavalry to the Philippines may have to be deferred until the middle of summer. This regiment is one of the five cavalry regiments provided for in the new army bill and is in course of organization at Fort Leavenworth. All the men have been recruited and all the supplies save the horses have long since arrived upon the grounds and although Uncle Sam is making unusual efforts to buy borses not a single animal

has come to hand as yet.

The proposals to furnish 428 head which were recently sent to Washington for ap-proval have been rejected by the secretary

of war. Those horses were to have been used to equip the first battation of the Fourteenth cavalry. Six contractors were found willing to undertake the job of furnishing the animals, their average bid per head being \$148, but this, in the estimation of the sec retary of war, was too much. He had been accustomed to buying cavalry horses for \$45 and \$50, and the price seemed exerbitant So he has canceled the bids, and has issued another lot of advertising circulars, railing for sealed proposals in triplicate to be sub-

mitted by March 23. May Telegraph Bids.

to expedite their olds as much as possible. They are reminded that the usual thirty days of time cannot be allowed in this case. Owing to the limited time for submitting proposals," they say, "bids may be made by telegraph, to be supplemented later by formal proposals by mail. Delivery will be required to commence by April 1, and be completed, if awards are made, by May 20." It is observed that the new circular calls for only 250 head of horses instead of the original 428.
