1. Chapter liv of the Criminal Code, which authorises the prosecution of criminal offenses by information, does not violate the rule of uniformity prescribed by section 19, article vi of the constitution.

2. Said chapter liv of the Criminal Code authorizes the filing of an information or an indictment in each and every county and to every district court and hence is general in its operation and not special.
